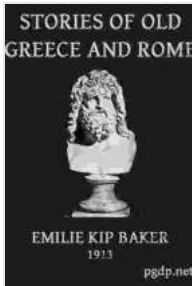

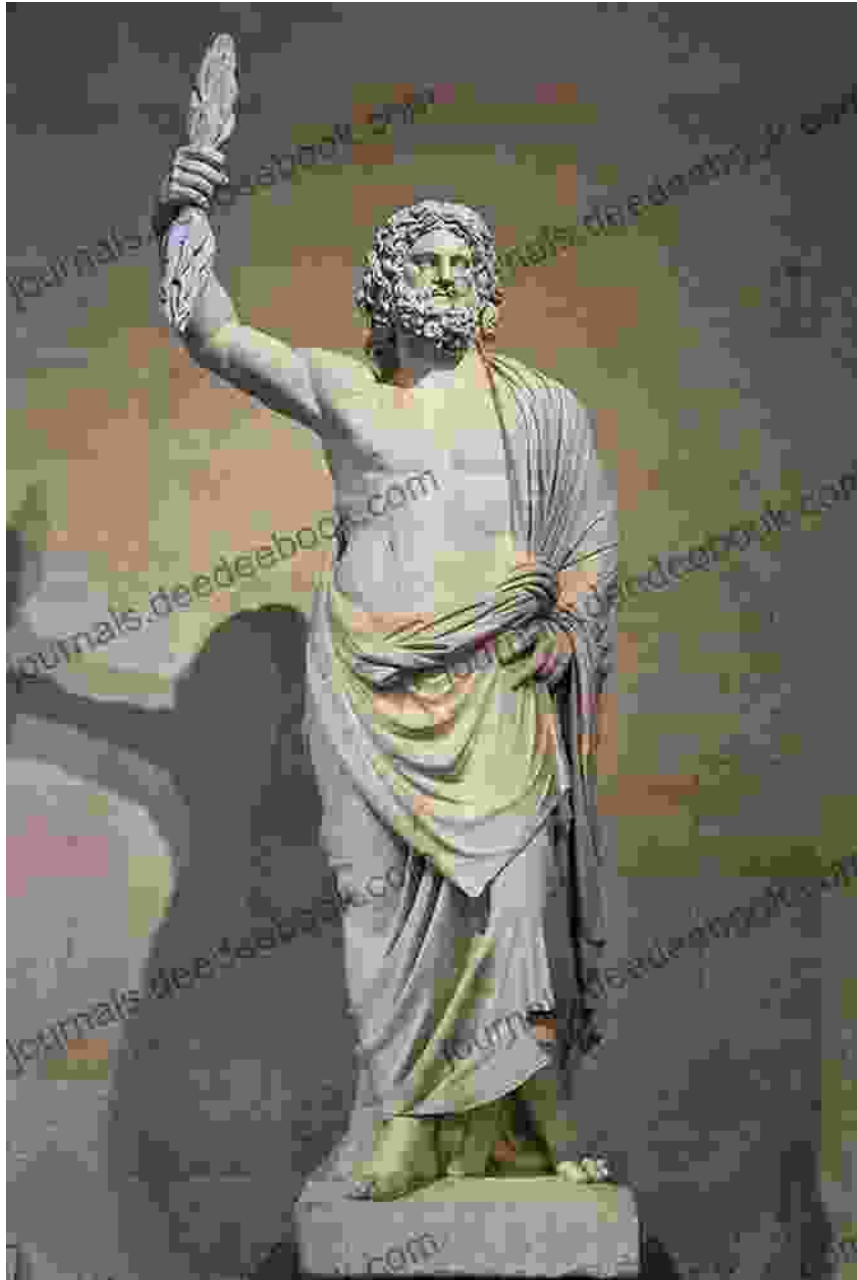

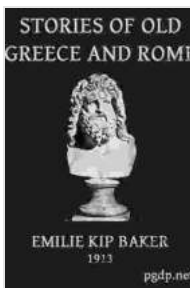


A Greek vase depicting scenes from Greek mythology

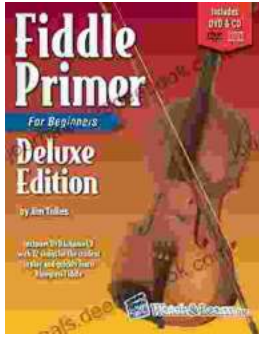

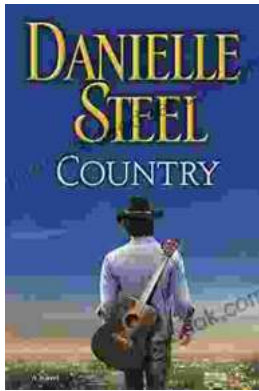
