Cast On

- 2. Insert your needle into the loop and hook the yarn from behind.
- 3. Pull the yarn through the loop onto the needle.
- 4. Repeat steps 1-3 until you have 24 stitches on your needle.

Garter Stitch Section

1. Knit every row for 12 inches.

Rib Stitch Section

- 1. Knit 1, purl 1 for 6 rows.
- 2. Knit 2, purl 2 for 6 rows.
- 3. Knit 3, purl 3 for 6 rows.
- 4. Knit 4, purl 4 for 6 rows.
- 5. Knit 5, purl 5 for 6 rows.
- 6. Knit 6, purl 6 for 6 rows.
- 7. Knit 7, purl 7 for 6 rows.
- 8. Knit 8, purl 8 for 6 rows.

Bind Off

- 1. Knit two stitches.
- 2. Insert the left-hand needle into the first stitch on the right-hand needle.
- 3. Lift the first stitch over the second stitch.
- 4. Slide the first stitch off the needle.
- 5. Repeat steps 2-4 until only one stitch remains on the needle.
- 6. Cut the yarn, leaving a 6-inch tail.
- 7. Thread the tail through the last stitch and pull tight to close the opening.

Fringe Trim

- 1. Cut 12 strands of yarn, each measuring approximately 12 inches long.
- 2. Fold each strand of yarn in half.
- 3. Insert the folded end of the yarn through a stitch on the cast-on edge of the scarf.
- 4. Pull the ends of the yarn through the loop to create a knot.
- 5. Repeat steps 3-4 for all stitches along the cast-on edge.


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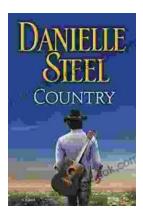


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
